PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Head-of-the-Harbor held a public hearing on the 15th day of January, 2014, at 7:00 P.M., at Village Hall, 500 North Country Road, St. James, New York, and duly adopted a Local Law as follows:

LOCAL LAW (Intro) NO. 1 OF 2014

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING VILLAGE CODE § 153-3 STOP AND YIELD SIGNS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF HEAD-OF-THE-HARBOR AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this local law is to regulate the obstruction of traffic at intersections in supplement of N.Y. Vehicle and Traffic Law § 1175.

- A. The title of \S 153-3 is amended to read Stop and Yield Signs and Marked Intersection Signs.
 - B. Section 153-3(C) is enacted as follows:
 - C. Notwithstanding any official traffic control signal indication to proceed and excepting the order of a police officer otherwise, a driver of a vehicle shall not enter an intersection unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection to accommodate completely the vehicle driven without obstructing in any manner the through passage of vehicles from either

side. In no event shall a driver enter an intersection described in Schedule D below marked by a Do Not Block Intersection sign except while observing the restrictions of this subsection.

C. Section 153-3, Schedule D, is enacted as follows:

SCHEDULE D. MARKED INTERSECTIONS

Name of Street Direction of Cross Street
Travel

Edgewood Avenue East Fifty Acre Road

SECTION 3. SEQRA.

This is a Type II action under 6 NYCRR 617.5(c)(20).

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY.

Should any part or provision of this local law be decided by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the local law as a whole nor any part thereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State as provided by law.

All persons in interest will be heard by the Board of Trustees at the public hearing to be held as aforesaid and may appear in person or by representative. The Village Hall is accessible to handicapped persons.
